

**Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held at 7.30pm on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> July 2016  
In West Stour Village Hall**

**PRESENT**: Cllrs Mrs B Edwards (Chairman), Mrs T Bagnall, Mrs R Blacklock, R Cowan, G Gilding, Mrs V Jones, Mrs E Newton, J Parker, Mrs E Scott, Mrs P Sealy, Lady A Stagg, Mrs J Watkins and Mrs C Wilkins. Also present the Clerk, Mrs M Cox, NDDCllr Jane Westbrook, PCSO Vicky Levy, Martin Hibbert (Footpath Liaison Officer) and 6 members of the public.

The Chairman welcomed those present.

**Reports, Pre-business matters and Public participation**

**Crime Report**

PCSO Vicky Levy said that there have been three reported crimes in Stour Row since the last meeting. There appears to be a spate of garden ornaments and statues that are being stolen. People were reminded to leave nothing valuable visible in cars.

Vicky was thanked for attending the meeting and her report.

**DCC MEMBER'S REPORT** – No report received.

**NDDC WARD MEMBERS' REPORT** – Cllr Jane Westbrook said that it is very quiet and there is not a lot going on.

As a way of DCC saving money Gillingham registrar's office is closing. There is a consultation going on at present. Should the registrar office close it will affect tourism. Members were all encouraged to complete the survey, also the Parish Council to respond.

Henstridge Airfield there is likely to be an increase in aerobatic flying, which will be carefully monitored.

There are changes to dairy farming husbandry where big herds are now mixed including young stock. The animals are moved every 3 to 4 days and they do not settle. Extra land is needed and this affects the footpaths. There are restriction on what species of bulls are allowed on the land.

The planning department is being reorganised into departments, commercial, fast track and development, when it is delivered it will get better.

Jane was thanked for her report.

**Public Discussion** – none.

**Footpath Liaison Officer's report** - Mr Hibbert said that the hedges and foliage are growing fast. Also the maize crop and he has contacted landowners where the maize has obstructed footpaths.

We have received the final confirmation of footpaths 7 & 22 diversions at Udder Farm Shop to east of Sandilands Close, East Stour (agenda item 16).

Footpath 64, Meads Farm, Stour Provost, the diversion is being consulted upon. Martin said that he is happy with the proposed route and as there are no issues he recommends that it goes ahead.

There is an application forthcoming to divert Footpath 13, West Stour from the developer (new owner of the barn).

The Lyde Hill footpath issue is still ongoing and Cllr Cattaway still has to make contact with Mr C Trim.

Footpath at Stour Provost Mill there have been a lot of contentious issues with the villagers and the householder. Martin asked that walkers consider both sides.

In September 2015 (min ref 2015/132) it was agreed that the Parish Council purchase a hard wood finger post sign at Duncliffe Wood costing £234 + vat. It should be installed soon and the cost is still the same.

The White Hart Link (a circular route that links major towns) is progressing.

Martin was thanked for helping with the clearing of trees at Stower Provost Community School, it was much appreciated.

Martin was thanked for his report and for all that he does for the footpaths.

**Tree Liaison Officers' report**

Cllr Mrs Bagnall reported on the 5 Ash trees at East Stour playing field that were sent off to the Forestry Commission for testing. One has tested positive for Chalara. All five samples have bacterial canker. Cllr Mrs Bagnall is awaiting further instructions from NDDC on how to proceed. However in the meantime there is a need to do some clearing up around the trees. Cllr Mrs Bagnall was thanked for following this up.

Stour Provost, Stour Row, Todber and West Stour – nothing to report.

Flood Wardens' report – There was some flash flooding on Monday. Nothing else to report.

Transport – Cllr Mrs Newton said that she was unable to attend the meeting but when she receives the minutes they will be circulated.

### **Business Agenda**

Cllr Cowan gave the following tribute to Gordon Herring: "I think most if not all present will know that Gordon Herring died on 26 May. Gordon served in the Army for nearly 40 years and moved to Todber after he retired. He was a parish councillor from 2003 until 2007, becoming Todber Parish Chairman in 2004, and joined the Council once again in 2012. He actively supported the RNLI and collected very successfully for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Gordon was interested in and engaged with people. He was always straightforward, very much the officer and gentleman, and a good a loyal friend".

All members present stood for a moment of quiet reflection.

**2016/99 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE** were received from Cllrs P Bowe, P Brown, P Gould, T Jones and J Nalty.

Cllr Mrs Wilkins second DAPTC representative. Proposed by Cllr Mrs Sealy, seconded by Cllr J Parker. Agreed by all. Cllr Parker did say that at the next DAPTC Northern Area meeting there will be a presentation of DCC Highway changes, which will affect communities from April 1<sup>st</sup> 2017.

#### **2016/106 MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 12<sup>th</sup> MAY 2016.**

Item 2016/80 East Stour Crossroads should read "At a previous meeting it was agreed to be tolerant of "advertising signs" posted on street furniture not at the crossroads. However it is felt that these signs are a distraction to drivers and it was agreed that there be no signs allowed at the crossroads." Also Item 2016/94 it was authorised to purchase 'Arnold Baker on Local council Administration' for £69 discounted price (instead of £92). The minutes were duly amended and then were **agreed and adopted** as a correct record of the meeting and duly signed. Proposed by Cllr R Cowan and Mrs J Watkins.

#### **2016/107 MATTERS ARISING**

- West Stour bus shelter. The Clerk has perused the deeds and documents held at Lloyds Bank and has asked Mrs West (previous Clerk and Chairman) and there are no documents relating to the shelter. The shelter was demolished many years ago.

- The Arnold Baker book now costs ££73.60 as it was not ordered before 28<sup>th</sup> May. There was no notification of when the 25% discount ended.

### **2016/108 CASUAL VACANCIES, ONE FOR EAST STOUR WARD AND ONE FOR TODBER WARD**

Mr Nigel Lithgow has agreed to be co-opted for East Stour ward, this will be done at the next meeting when Mr Lithgow will be in attendance.

Todber ward no nominations at the present.

### **2016/109 NATIONAL SALARY AWARD**

It was resolved that the Clerk's hourly rate be increased to £10.944 with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2016 and with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 to £11.054 per hour as per NJC for Local Government Services. Proposed by Cllr Parker and seconded by Cllr Lady Stagg

### **2016/110 HIGHWAY MATTERS**

- Todber (B3092) – Roger Bell, DCC Highways reported that the 150mm Centre Lines around the bend at Red Lane are now painted and the missing warning sign has been replaced. He is still awaiting results of talks of missing lines from last summer (out of his hands) but will keep us updated. New chevron signage from Michael Potter has been ordered (1/2 months to install).  
SID at Todber - Cllr Cowan said that it was hoped that DCC would have accepted the information following the police checks of traffic speeds would be sufficient and preclude the need for installation of speed tubes. However this is not the case and DCC has said that the police data is not conclusive enough and DCC will have to carry out the survey by using speed tubes. This will mean that Todber Parish will have to pay DCC £200/300 for the survey. It is possible that there will be minor changes to the road layout of Red Lane. Slow progress is being made.
- Head Lane, East Stour – Nothing to report.
- East Stour Crossroads – Roger Bell reported that the new sign (give way 400m) should be in by the time of your meeting (it wasn't). He proposed 3 yellow lines not raised with 'SLOW' when approaching from Todber, but felt that raised yellow line would be better but that would be a noise issue. (The Parish Council has agreed to these measures). SID, East Stour 2 places have been marked along Back Street for the SID.
- Hunger Hill East Stour – It was agreed to ask DCC Highways to mark 'Slow' and yellow rumble strips along the highway. Proposed Cllr Mrs Blacklock, seconded by Cllr Mrs Edwards.
- Fifehead Magdalen Crossroads – Cllr R Gosney (Kington Magna and Buckhorn Parish Council) has forwarded the latest e-mail correspondence from DCC regarding the vehicle activated sign (VAS). The installation has been delayed now to at least October (target date was July 2016), which is very disappointing. Cllr Gosney has asked Andrew Brown, DCC that the VAS be installed now as the risk continues to exist until the improvement is implemented. Cllr Jane Westbrook having experienced the dangers at the crossroads has asked for the e-mails about this and will follow this matter up. Jane was thanked.

### **2016/112 CHURCH CLOSE, TODBER**

Planning application 2/2016/0286/VARIA will be discussed/decided at the Planning Committee on the 19<sup>th</sup> July. Cllr Cowan proposes to speak at the meeting and object to the application.

### **2016/113 CORRESPONDENCE**

E-mail received from Mr N Brennan regarding speed watch in Stour Row (previously circulated). He has asked that the speed watch signs which are still displayed in Stour Row that they be removed and only used when there are speed checks taking place. He thinks that this is a total waste of Police resources and money. The speed tubes data does not show there is a problem with vehicles speeding through the village. He asks why speed checks are being carried out when there is not a need and that residents with young children with no road safety awareness that do not have entrance gates to their properties have them fitted to prevent young children running into the road? This would be a far better safety measure than speed checks.

Cllr Mrs Watkins said that the placing of the signs has been referred to Roger Bell and PCSO Vicky Levy. It has been noticed that there has been very little action from the Speedwatch team just lately.

### **2016/114 DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL MATTERS**

- Changes to the definitive map and statement – East Stour – public paths diversion order in respect of parts of Footpaths 7 and 22 (already reported by Martin Hibbert).
- Section 119 Highways Act, proposed diversion of Footpath 64, Stour Provost (already reported by Martin Hibbert, which he recommended to go ahead). No objections raised.

### **2016/115 NORTH DORSET DISTRICT COUNCIL MATTERS**

- Non-receipt of Police Crime Commissioner Polling cards in some wards. Some people contacted NDDC and were told that it was Royal Mail's fault. By the amount that were not delivered this was thought not to be the problem. It was resolved that the Clerk write to the Returning Officer at North Dorset D C expressing the Parish Council's disapproval and say that the returning officer is obliged by law to check that the pol cards have been successfully issued and ask what measures are in place to monitor the distribution.
- Consultation on community infrastructure levy draft charging schedule (e-mail circulated 16.6.16) consultation closes at 4pm 29<sup>th</sup> July 2016.

### **2016/116 GILLINGHAM SOUTHERN EXTENSION**

Cllr Gilding said he was very grateful and thanked Cllr David Walsh for allowing NDDCllr Jane Westbrook and himself to attend the Gillingham Growth Board meeting. The response to the questions asked at the meeting have been circulated. The Consortium members are interested in what Cllr Gilding and the Parish Council have to say and we have received a good response. It was a valuable experience and we were listened to, especially about highway safety. Phase I, 91 house will be built, phase II 400+ houses will be built. When phase I has been completed we will be able to establish the effect of the traffic and what types of traffic are using the B3092. There are lots of plans but no real information. It was a good meeting which has opened some doors, especially with the Highways consultant. Cllr Gilding reported that speed tubes had been placed along the B3092 and will ask for a copy of the data.

### **2016/117 NEW WAR MEMORIAL IN EAST STOUR**

Cllr Gilding said that on the 31<sup>st</sup> May there was a fund raising talk to honour the memory of an East Stour man, who died in the Battle of Jutland. It was held exactly 100 years to the day since the Battle of Jutland. £190 was raised for the East Stour memorial project. It was a good evening.

### **2016/118 EAST STOUR PLAYING FIELD PROPOSED PATH**

Nothing to report.

### **2016/119 THE USE OF EAST STOUR PLAYING FIELD BY OTHER ORGANISATIONS**

East Stour Playing Field Committee has been approached by Ian Lyster to use the field to run a Dorset Food Fair event 27<sup>th</sup> May 2017. There has been a brief meeting discussing an outline plan. Mr Lyster organising and runs events throughout Dorset. East Stour is happy for them to use the field, also it would be a great opportunity and benefit to the Village. They will have arrangements in place for insurance, highways and security for the three day event. Fast Feet Football will have to be relocated for that weekend, Ian Lyster will contact them directly about this. When we have firm details, we must as a council let our insurers know of the event. TESS will be holding a small village event next year. It was agreed that this could go ahead, proposed by Cllr Parker, seconded by Cllr Cowan.

### **2016/120 WASTE BIN, EAST STOUR**

Cllr Mrs Bagnall having followed up the request for a waste bin said that The Dorset Waste Partnership has agreed that we can have a bin providing the parish council pays for it to be emptied. The cost of a new bin is approximately £300 plus installation (the Parish Council has funds for this). DWP would empty the bin weekly and the cost would be approximately £200 per annum. Can this cost be justified as there are already 2 bins in the Village? The bin that was removed from the Hall cannot be returned. It was resolved not to go ahead with the purchase of the bin as it is not cost effective. Proposed by Cllr Mrs Watkins, seconded by Cllr Parker. Cllr Mrs Bagnall will write and let Mrs Gould know of the Council's decision.

### **2016/121 TO REVISE THE PROVISION OF A GRANT TO EAST STOUR VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE**

A letter from Mr D Little, Chairman of East Stour Village Hall saying that the grant of £2625 which was approved (min ref 2016/25) has got complicated in both timing and amended estimates. East Village Hall Committee requests a variation of the items to be funded. Cllr Gilding has spoken to HMRC and it is in order that the Parish Council purchase the goods and gives the goods to East Stour Village Hall and that it is in order we can reclaim the vat paid. The total cost is now £2,950 (including vat). It was resolved that we pay for the items:- 3 air extractors £912, remaining main hall curtains £1,012, curtains and blinds Post Office room £1,026. Proposed by Cllr Mrs Newton, seconded by Cllr Parker.

### **2016/122 TELEPHONE KIOSK EAST STOUR**

Grants of £100 each received from East Stour Society and Stours Villages Market towards the refurbishment of the kiosk. This was greatly appreciated. Clerk to write and thank for the kind donations.

Cllr Mrs Blacklock updated the meeting about the kiosk, the outside has been finished, however there has been trouble with the paint on the door which needs rectifying. The whole project is well on its way to being finished. The cost (£288) so far has been more than expected. It will be used as a library.

West Stour has started refurbishing their kiosk.

Clerk to write and ask Royal Mail if we can repaint the post boxes as some are an eyesore. Proposed by Cllr Mrs Blackmore, seconded by Cllr Mrs Bagnall and agreed.

### **2016/123 TRAVELLERS**

Cllr Jane Westbrook reported that the travellers have moved to St James' Common. Paula Clover has visited them there. Paula has reported that the rubbish had not been cleared at Five Bridges. There has been a siting of a caravan at Five Bridges. We cannot prevent the travellers returning to Five Bridges. Five Bridges could be made an official site which would be managed by DCC, a rent would be paid and certain laws would have to be abided by. However there is no available funding this year. Cllrs David Walsh and Andrew Cattaway and Ms Paula Clover are pushing for funding. There is to be a consultation at the end of the year. Cllr Jane Westbrook will find out more about taking the consultation forward. The meeting agreed that there is a need to include Buckhorn Weston and Kington Magna Parish Council in any consultation.

### **2016/124 SUPERFAST BROADBAND**

Everybody knows about this. Some places the speed is slow and about a dozen places cannot get superfast in Stour Row. Clerk to query this. If you can't get superfast one alternative is using a mobile signal.

*The Chairman opened the meeting to the public.*

### **2016/125 COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH**

Stour Row - Proposal for improving cost effective road safety through Stour Row Village, Highways Agency recommendations.

Cllr Mrs Watkins (Chairman of Stour Provost Parish read out the following statement about Stour Row Speed Check (copy attached).

Mr M Whitfield Stour Row Speedwatch Co-ordinator also produced a paper of support to the safety for the Community of Stour Row and their Speedwatch reports Oct 15 – to date. Mr Whitfield said that there appears to be excess speeding of vehicles from the Todber direction. He and others are concerned as there are children in the Village that use the playground by the hall. Vehicles do slow down on Thursday afternoons only because there are vehicles parked outside the hall. Even tractor drivers do not keep to their speed limit of 40kph. The Chairman suggested that maybe Mr Whitfield and his neighbours park their cars on the road, which might help reduce speeding. The Stour Row Speedwatch team can only monitor traffic from one direction and this can only be done in decent weather and in the daytime and cannot be carried out at night. DCC is not in favour of more paintwork or signage. By having gateway signage it would bring to the attention of drivers that they are entering a village and hopefully make drivers slow down.

The Council responded saying that there is already sufficient signage when entering Stour Row, a 30mph sign, "Stour Row Please Drive Carefully" and a pedestrian sign. The white gates would be placed under the existing signage along Dover Street. The purchase and fitting of 4 village gateways is £1788 + vat.

Cllr Gilding said that he has spent a lot of time investigating speed issues within the Stours Parish Council area and that any measure to reduce speed costs money. Some drivers if they want to speed they will and this happens in every village. DCC Highways hear this day in and out and are unable to get something done due to the lack of finances. There is no money for chicanes. The suggestion of wearing high visibility jackets when checking speed was made.

Cllr Parker said that the idea of gateways seems unpopular with the Parish Council and that the Parish Council needs to be prudent and sensible with precept monies. As a financial view would you get value for the money spent and some people may object to how other people's money is spent. The evidence is not great and some drivers do slow down but only 2/3 mph.

Cllr Gilding suggested that it might be a good idea to get the Villagers and tractor drivers together and discuss the problem.

Cllr Cowan said that from the figures produced the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile is not high enough to warrant a 'SID', looking at the data it shows that a small number of drivers are going too fast early in the morning and or late at night. The Department of Transport has published a lengthy document and they concluded that the greatest reduction of speed 1 or 2mph if village gateways are put up.

The Chairman concluded that the Village has a meeting and comes back to the Parish Council with more solid proposals.

The Council to consider the purchase of 4 village gateways for Stour Row at a cost of £1788 + VAT – no proposal motion failed.

*The Chairman closed the meeting to the public and resumed the business agenda.*

#### **2016/126 STOUR ROW WELL**

Confirmation from Roger Bell, Highways, DCC that Stour Row own the well in the middle of the Village. Cllr Mrs Watkins has also received an e-mail from the Environmental Agency stating that permission is not required to repair and reinstate the well. Mr Rob Marks will rebuild the well. It was agreed that Stour Provost Parish adopt Stour Row Well, proposed by Cllr Mrs Watkins, seconded by Cllr Mrs Jones. Clerk to add this to the asset register and to notify Came & Co (our insurers).

#### **2016/127 ALL SAINTS STOUR ROW**

A Woolley and Wallis for sale sign is up. The Church has put some planning conditions on the sale. There has been some interest in the property.

#### **2016/128 STOUR PROVOST CRICKET CLUB**

Secure storage facilities. Defer to next meeting when the figures should be available.

#### **2016/129 STOUR PROVOST BARBARIANS**

Mr Griffins was not satisfied with the minutes of 12<sup>th</sup> May, (his e-mail previously circulated). Cllr Nalty has previously met with Mr Griffin to discuss the unacceptable behaviour of the football team. Cllr Mrs Watkins said that there will be a Stour Provost playing field committee meeting (which includes a representative each from the cricket club and the football club) in late August and this will be discussed at the meeting.

#### **2016/130 THE PENSION REGULATOR**

The Stours Parish Council as an employer has to legally put certain staff into a pension scheme. The Clerk needs to be aged between 22 and state pension age and earn £833 per month. As the Clerk's salary is below £833 a month we do not meet the criteria to be Automatically Enrolled, the Parish Council is not obligated to set up a pension scheme. However there will be other duties that the employer will need to perform. As an employer they will need to write to their staff members informing them they can join a scheme and they will have to declare their compliance with The Pensions Regulator by 31 March 2017. The Parish Council must write to the Clerk inviting her to join a pension scheme. The Chairman will write to the Clerk.

#### **2016/131 FINANCE – ACCOUNTS for the period 1<sup>st</sup> May 2016 – 30<sup>th</sup> June 2016**

Balances of Accounts from statements as at 30<sup>th</sup> June 2016 – NSB £4,964.92. Scottish Widows Bank – £24,678.97 Lloyds plc – £7,351.46.

The Dorset's Clinical Commission Group AGM was held at Wimborne. They have just concluded a Clinical Services Review and it should be going out to consultation on their recommendations in the Autumn.

Cllr Lady Stagg said that she was unable to attend the Dorset branch open day at Waterstone Manor, Puddletown on Sunday July 10<sup>th</sup> due to a previous engagement.
